What are Procedural Safeguards?



The IDEA includes rights for parents and protections for parents and students

Rights and protections are found in the Procedural Safeguards Notice

The school must provide you with a written explanation of your rights under the IDEA and Michigan Administrative Rules for Special Education (MARSE)

Section 504



Section 504

Section 504 covers qualified students with disabilities who attend schools receiving federal financial assistance. To be protected under Section 504, a student must be determined to:

- (1) have a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more major life activities; or
- (2) have a record of such an impairment; or
- (3) be regarded as having such an impairment.

FERPA

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act or FERPA provides certain rights for parents regarding their children's education records.
